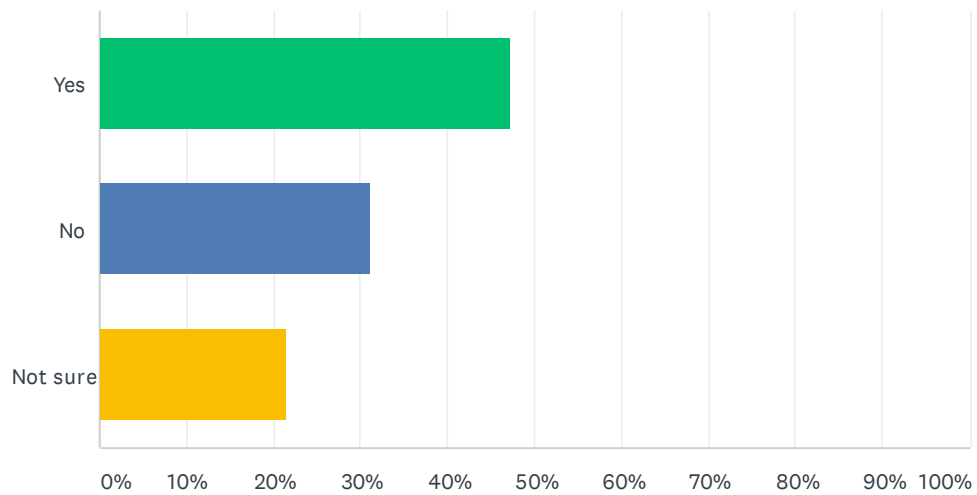


Q1 When you first became aware of the novel coronavirus outbreak did you think it might become serious in the US?

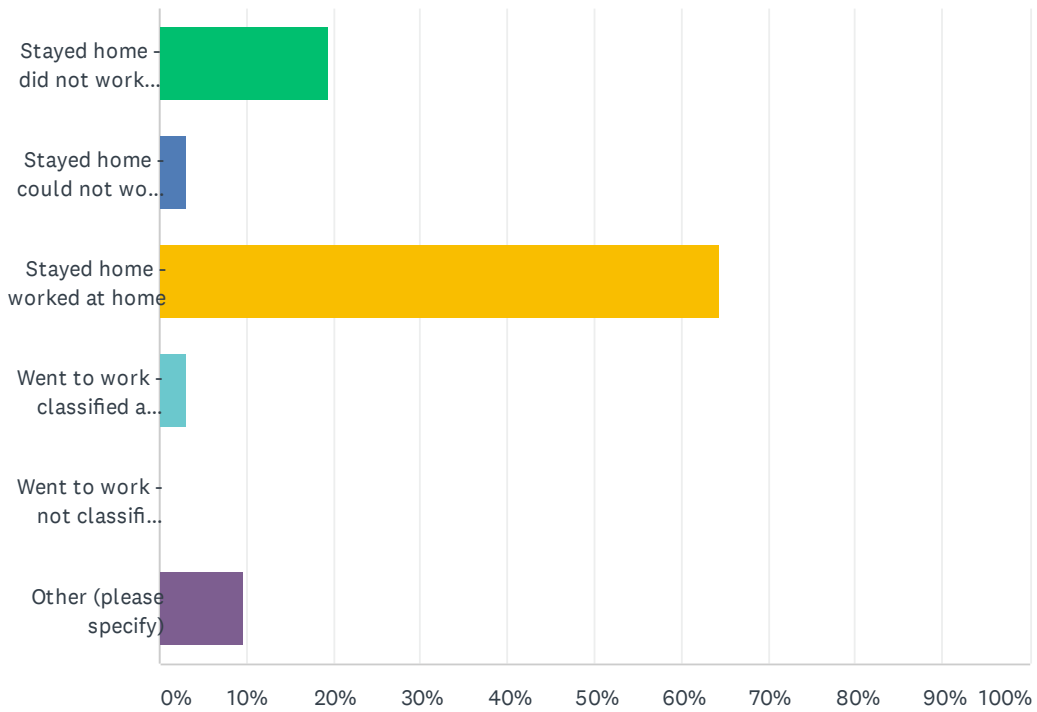

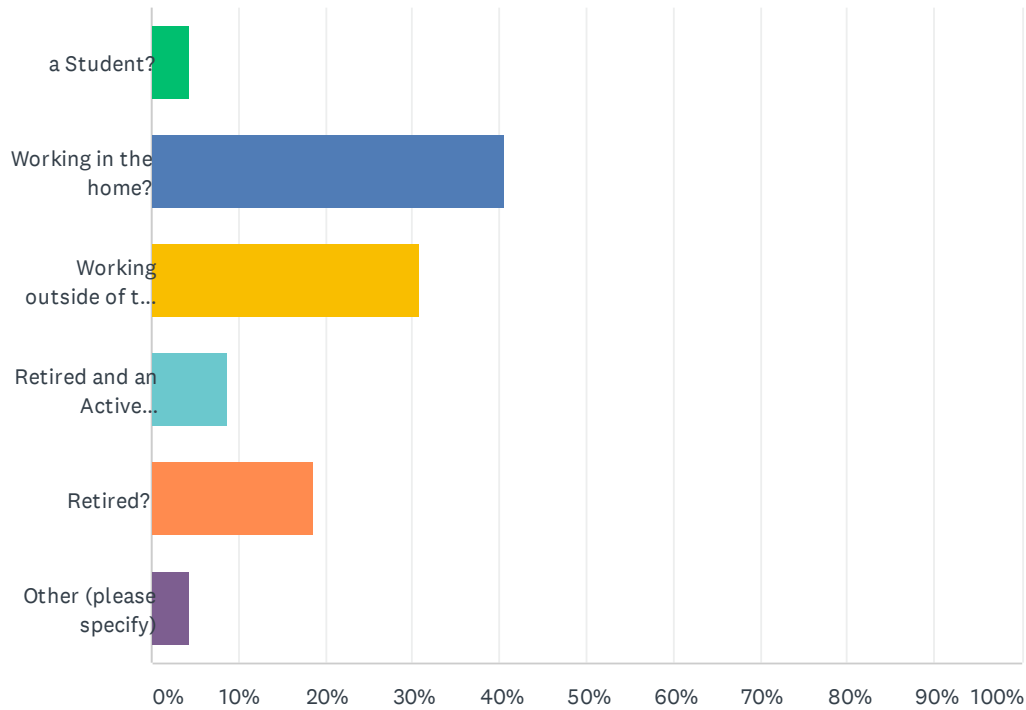

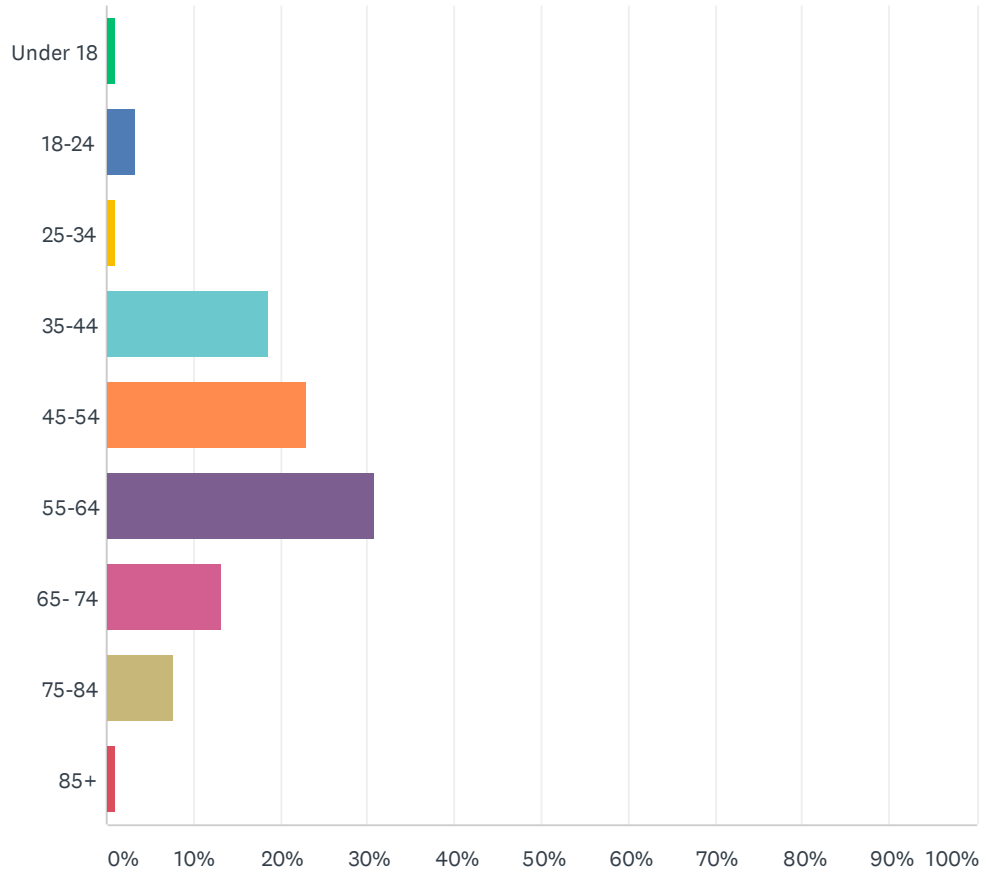

Q9 What is your age group

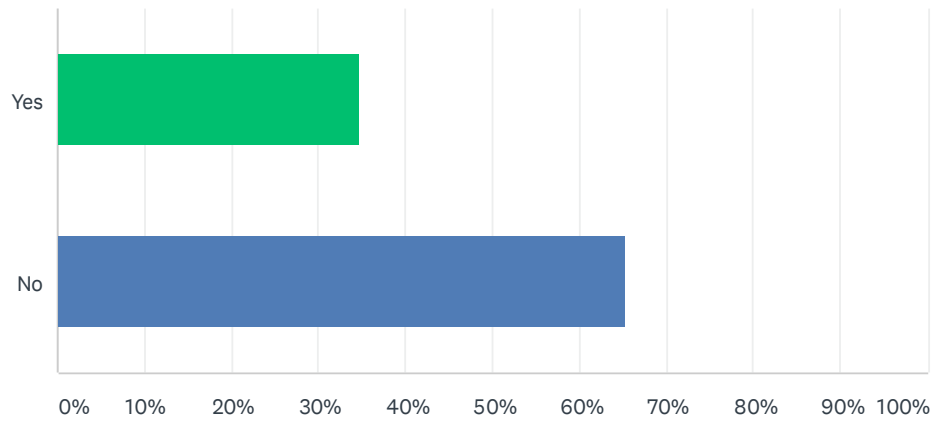
